There's nothing to eat!!

Recently a group of Estes members traveled to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, on a medical campaign. Although they encountered some air travel problems, they all returned safely. Many Estes members have been on campaigns to Haiti and, in some ways, I wish that everyone at Estes could visit Haiti at least once. For me personally, I have found that going to Haiti has had a fundamental effect on my attitudes about priorities, money, other forms of wealth, and my general lifestyle. Working in Haiti can be transformative for any Christian.

In Matthew 6:31-32 Jesus discusses the Christian's relationship with material things—one of the issues that visiting Haiti raises. His point is that we should not worry about material things such as food, drink, and clothing. We should develop a more spiritual mindset like the Bible encourages.

Jesus tells us not to be anxious about earthly matters: "Do not worry then, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear for clothing?' (Matt. 6:31, NASB). Even though we live in a wealthy country and typically do not run short on these items (food, drink and clothing), we still hear some version of these questions. Concerning food, we hear, "There is nothing to eat" or "I can't find anything to eat." What we actually mean is "there is nothing we want to eat" or "it's time to eat but nothing appeals to me." The point is that we typically have plenty to eat, but the kinds of food available aren't appealing. Considering how many are starving in our world, such an attitude is self-centered.

With drink, we typically reflect the same attitude, "There's nothing to drink." We have drink readily available right out of the faucet, but that and other choices don't appeal to us. We want something tasty. Often we want beverages that aren't even good for us.

With clothing we may say, "I have nothing to wear" or "I need something to wear to a wedding/party/the first day of school," but clearly we do have clothes. We want a better selection. Or, maybe we want new clothes that are more in style. We want clothes that make us feel good about ourselves and impress other people.

While these ideas reflect a concern about the basics of life, in our country, they also reflect a concern for money and what it will buy. In Haiti most people do not have enough food or drinkable water. The clothes they wear are obviously used and sometimes hardly more than rags. Many of those listening to Jesus preach the Sermon on the Mount were not much better off than today's Haitians. Yet he still tells them that worrying about food, drink and clothing is not good. Why does he say this?

In verse 32 he gives two answers to that question. First, Jesus says that worrying about these things is what pagans do. Christians should be transformed to a new way of thinking that is more spiritual and less earthly. Worrying about physical things ties us to the limited perspective of this life and the things associated with it. Our priorities should be on the spiritual rather than the status and comfort material goods can afford us.

Answer two tells us how we should think. Jesus tells us that our Father in heaven knows that we need food, drink, and clothing and that he will meet these needs. (See Matt. 7:11.) We should place our trust in the Lord and then we will learn to live without anxiety about our physical needs.

To transform our lives we must transform our thinking. Don't be anxious about life's basic needs; God will provide.
