IMPACT

CHANGING OUR COMMUNITY, CHURCH & HEARTS

Last Sunday Estes launched the Impact ministry – an outreach and benevolence effort designed to show the love of God in very real and very tangible ways. We placed cards on the Impact board labeled \$1 – \$100. With a deadline set for Nov. 26 and a goal of \$5,050, we had about two months to encourage the congregation to take all of the cards. We never imagined that all of the cards would be gone in the first eight hours. Whether you committed \$1 or \$100 (or more), you made a difference. Thank you for your remarkable display of excitement and generosity.

Below is a little more information on the Impact ministry.

What is Impact?

Impact is an outreach and benevolence ministry designed to show God's love to members of the Estes family and the community of Henderson. The program will also encourage Estes members to examine our own hearts and be intentional about sharing time, money, love and other resources. Impact is about putting love into action. "Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth." I John 3:18

Why do this?

Quite simply – this is the kind of thing that Jesus would do. We see numerous examples in scripture of Christ serving those around him. We are instructed in scripture to not simply talk about love and generosity but to show love and generosity. People recognized Christ's love through his actions, and as His followers, we should reveal the same spirit of care and compassion in all we do. The goal of Impact is to honor God alone and expose our community to His love. "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13:34-35

Where does the money go?

There are two components of the Impact ministry. A significant percentage of the Impact funds will be directed toward internal benevolence. There are those among our family at Estes who have real needs, and the program seeks to meet those needs in a way that has long-term impacts. There will also be coordinated efforts focused on community service and outreach. Acts of Random Kindness events and other efforts will provide the congregation with an opportunity to show kindness to the community. A committee composed of three elders, the Incite committee and the church treasurer will oversee the distribution of the funds.

How can you be involved?

If you took a card off the board, talk about the commitment you made with your family and work together to honor that commitment by Nov. 26. If the cards were gone before you had a chance to take one, don't let that stop you. Impact contribution envelopes are on the table in the lobby. The envelopes allow you to direct your contribution to internal benevolence, external outreach or both efforts. Place your envelope in the donation box or give it to an elder. Finally, be more generous and actively seek out opportunities to serve others.

It is exciting to think how this ministry can have an impact on our community, our church and our hearts.
