We live in a busy world. It seems none of us want to be bored anymore. With our smart phones and other post-PC devices, we are always able to surf the internet, look at Facebook (and other forms of social media), and quite literally have the option to never be bored. The psychologists and other mental health experts suggest this is not always a good thing as often time in our boredom, we become creative and new inventions happen. But, that's not the point. We can be busy and, often, we take the opportunity.

Then, there are those moments when we do not know what to say. Perhaps, we are visiting someone with a chronic or terminal illness and we are speechless. There are crises and other events in life that leave us with no words. We want to visit others in the middle of their own desperation but avoid it because we do not know what to say. Maybe we are looking for something profound to say. Yet, we have all been in those moments when we have said the profound and it did not comfort any-one. We were ultimately embarrassed and wished we had said nothing at all.

Maybe therein lies the answer for which we have been looking. What do we say when we do not know what to say? Maybe, we should say nothing and be bored in the moment. Job experienced great turmoil in just a few short hours or days at most. He lost his wealth and his children. His wife was ready to discontinue their commitment to God. Then, his friends came and the text says they sat for seven days (Job 2:13). While there is historical evidence to indicate that a death ritual was taking place (Job looked so bad that his friends treated him as though he was dead), it may be that his friends were simply speechless. If I were to see someone covered in sores from the top of their head to the soles of their feet, I might not have anything to say! It is interesting that when Job's friends began talking, they assumed the wrong things and were not too comforting.

Maybe that is just the point. Presence can comfort. Sometimes, there simply are no words. There is nothing profound that will comfort. There is nothing to say that will make anything better. There simply are no words. In those moments of crisis, maybe presence is the answer. Let's go to our friends and family and just sit and be bored. Just sit. Do not say anything. Do not get caught up on our phones. Just sit. Be bored. The silence may communicate more love than words ever could.
