Doing What I Think I Can't

"You must do the things you think you cannot do."—Eleanor Roosevelt

Our lives are full of hard things. Sometimes those hard things seem to overwhelm our very beings. We look at the mountain of seemingly insurmountable tasks, problems, family illnesses, government turmoil, and self-doubt and feel the urge to give up. Sometimes, we are faced with just one hard thing that seems impossible to endure. It might give us comfort to know that we are not alone in the trepidation we feel when facing life's problems. David, God's chosen king, often cries out in the Psalms in human fear and frustration. In Psalm 55, he describes looking out at a scene of chaos:

... I see violence and strife in the city. Day and night they prowl about on its walls; malice and abuse are within it. Destructive forces are at work in the city; threats and lies never leave its streets. (Psalms 55:9-11)

In the political and social climate we live in today, we might relate to David's description. As Christians, we are certainly affected by these worldly problems even though we know that our ultimate home is above. However, our difficulties might even come from within God's family. Later in chapter 55, David writes of the excruciating experience of being betrayed by a friend, even a fellow worshipper in the "house of God":

If an enemy were insulting me, I could endure it; if a foe were rising against me, I could hide. But it is you, a man like myself, my companion, my close friend, with whom I once enjoyed sweet fellowship at the house of God, as we walked about among the worshipers. (Psalms 55 12-14)

Centuries later, we are able to comprehend the powerful emotions in this passage. One of the ways that we get through life is with the constant love of our "companions," our "close friends" in Christ who, with us, "walk about among the worshipers."

Our earthly troubles also come from these vessels that we live in. Enduring the illness of a loved one or going through the pain of disease and other physical problems are constant reminders that our lives here are temporary. Solomon warns us not to confuse the physical and the spiritual: "The human spirit can endure in sickness, but a crushed spirit who can bear?" (Proverbs 18:14). So how do we deal with the problem of a "crushed spirit?" What do we do when the problems feel like mountains? Of course, we do have each other. Our Christian fellowship is a constant source of strength against the world and Satan's part in it. But along with human sources of help, the divine ones are invaluable. Paul encourages the Corinthians at the end of his letter to seek them. He reminds them (and us) of divine sources of strength against all of the struggles of life: "May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." (II Corinthians 13:14)

Finally, we can borrow some wisdom from Eleanor Roosevelt tempered with Paul's. Mrs. Roosevelt famously said, "you must do the things you think you cannot do." As God's faithful people, we have extra assurance that we can do those things, even when we think we can't. Paul reminds us of that in Philippians 4: "I can do all this through him who gives me strength." The truth of our power to do and endure hard things is that it is not we, ourselves, who do them! I am so thankful for Paul's reminder of God's guiding care:

...I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength. (Philippians 4:11-13)
